Traditional Symbols of Easter, and their Origins?

EASTER EGGS - Easter is a religious holiday, but some of its customs, such as Easter eggs, are likely linked to pagan traditions. The egg, and ancient symbol of new life, has been associated with pagan festivals celebrating spring. From a Christian perspective, Easter eggs are said to represent Jesus' emergence from he tomb and resurrection. Decorating eggs for Easter is a tradition that dates back to at least the 13th century, according to some sources. One explanation for this custom is the eggs were formerly a forbidden food during the Lenten season, so people would paint and decorate them to ark the end of the period of penance and fasting, then eat them on Easter as a celebration.

EASTER BUNNY - The Bible makes no mention of a long-eared, short-tailed creature who delivers decorated eggs to well-behaved children on Easter Sunday; nevertheless, the Easter bunny has become prominent symbol of Christianity's not important holiday. The exact origins are unclear, but rabbits known to be prolific procreators, are an ancient symbol of fertility and new life. Some sources say the Easter bunny first arrived in America in 1700s with German immigrants who settled in Pennsylvania and transported their tradition of an egg-laying hare called "Osterhase" or "Oschter Haws". Their children made nests in which this creature could lay its colored eggs. The custom spread across the U. S. and the fabled rabbit's Easter morning expanded to include chocolate, other candy and gifts. Additionally, the children left out carrots in case he got hungry from hoping.



Why do we celebrate Saint Patrick's Day

St Patrick's Day is a global celebration of Irish culture on or around March 17. It particularly remembers St Patrick, one of Ireland's patron saints, who ministered Christianity in Ireland during the fifth century.

It was his extensive missionary work in Ireland for which Patrick is famous. During the thirty years of work there, he supposedly converted over 135,000 people, established 300 churches, and consecrated 350 bishops. Patrick died on March 17, 461.
